The Human Gene Mutation Database HGMD® Professional is a unique resource providing comprehensive data on human inherited disease mutations. Its compilation of structured, manually curated data from the peer-reviewed literature enables quick access to both single mutation queries and advanced search applications. HGMD® is widely used in human genetics research, diagnostics, and personal genomics applications. Among the benefits of using HGMD® are: quickly verify novel mutations, understand the mutational spectrum of a particular gene or disease, and assessing individual disease risk. Free and open to UF faculty, researchers, students, and staff.

The attendees will learn to:

- · look up mutation information for a gene of interest
- filter a gene's mutation information by an associated disease
- look up mutation information for a disease of interest
- browse for mutations by type of mutation (missense, nonsense, indel, etc.)
- perform advanced searches to identify mutations by criteria such as nucleotide and amino acid sequence context, affected genomic features, and more
- export mutation tracks for viewing in UCSC's genome browser

bring together the aging research community to share current findings and foster collaboration. This year we also celebrate the relocation of the UF IOA into the newly constructed Clinical Translational Research Building (CTRB).

Abstract Submission Guidelines: Please read these instructions carefully for your poster abstract submission process. Do not include figures, tables or mathematical equations in the abstract. The abstract text should not exceed 350 words. Avoid acronyms. If you use references, provide the journal, volume, year, and page numbers; however references count as words toward your abstract, and are not required. Spell out abbreviations the first time you use them.

Presentation of specific data and methodological details, clarity and brevity of writing and a clear statement regarding conclusions will assist in judging the quality of the research.

All abstracts must be received in final form no later than Friday, August 9, 2013. Send your Abstract in a WORD file to: Dr. Christy Carter, Department of Aging and Geriatric Research (cartercs@ufl.edu). Contact Dr. Carter by email if you have any questions.

Notification of acceptance or rejection will be emailed to the author no later than Friday August 16, 2013.
