American Lung Assn - Senior Research Training Fellowship Award / Biomedical Research Grant - due November 12

I want to be sure you are aware of an two opportunities for funding for post-docs/junior investigators from the American Lung Association. I would like to know if you or any of your colleagues choose to pursue an application, and would be happy to help with it. Please also forward this note to anyone else who might be interested.

1.) The objective of the Senior Research Training Fellowship Award is to support the training of MDs and PhDs seeking further academic training as scientific investigators with the goal of pursuing a career in pulmonary medicine and lung biology research.

MD or DO applicants must also have completed their clinical training, have some research experience, and be in their 3rd or 4th year of fellowship training at the time of application. Fellows with small amounts of clinical training to complete or clinical activity are eligible as long as they have a minimum of 75% effort devoted to research.

PhD applicants must be in their 1st or 2nd year of postdoctoral training at the time of application.

Persons with medical degrees, whose credentials show that they are on a career track which will not include the practice of medicine, must be in their 1st or 2nd year of full-time postdoctoral research.

Senior Research Training Fellowships are for \$32,500 per award year for up to two years.

The deadline for submissions is November 12, 2013.

2.) The objective of the **Biomedical Research Grant** is to provide seed monies to junior investigators researching the mechanisms of lung disease and general lung biology.

At the time of application, an applicant must hold a doctoral degree and have a faculty appointment or equivalent with demonstrated institutional commitment (salary support, research space). Fellows are eligible to apply only if their Department Chair can assure a promotion to faculty status by the start of the award. An applicant must have completed two years of post-doctoral esearch training by the start of the award.

Biomedical Research Grants are \$40,000 per award year for up to two years.

National Academy of Education/Spencer Fellowship Program

National Academy of Education/Spencer Postdoctoral Fellowship Program in Education Research *** The Postdoctoral Fellowship has undergone an applicant qualification change. Please note the new eligibility requirements pertaining to the date in which the doctoral degree was earned. *** The NAEd/Spencer Postdoctoral Fellowship Program supports early-career scholars working in critical areas of educational scholarship. Fellows will receive \$55,000 for one academic year of research, or \$27,500 for each of two contiguous years, working half time. Fellows will also attend professional development retreats and receive mentorship from NAEd members and other senior scholars in their field. Applicants must have had their PhD, EdD, or equivalent research degree conferred between January 1, 2008, and December 31, 2012. This fellowship is non-residential, and applications from all disciplines are encouraged. Up to twenty NAEd/Spencer Fellowships will be awarded.
