Durham University - 2014/15 International Fellowships for Research & Enterprise

Durham University is delighted to announce the fourth round of the Durham International Fellowship Scheme, designed to attract the most talented researchers in Europe and beyond and across the full spectrum of science, social science, arts and humanities, to build international networks of scholars with a common passion for today's most important research challenges.

Up to 11 postdoctoral **Junior Research Fellowships** are available commencing between 1 July 2014 and 1 October 2014. The closing date for applications is **06 December 2013**. The normal period of the Fellowship will be 12 - 15 months. We have applied to the EU for a formal extension to the DIFeREns project until 30 September 2016, and to extend Fellowships to that date (to a total of 24 - 27 months) if Fellows so desire. Applicants are requested to state whether they would wish to extend their Fellowship and to explain how the additional time would be used. Starting salaries will be in the range £30,424-£34,223 p.a.

In addition, up to ten **Senior Research Fellowships** and seven **Policy & Enterprise Fellowships** are available. The closing date for applications is **10 January 2014**. Fellowships are available for periods of 6 weeks to 6 months between October 2014 and September 2015 (with a typical stay of 3 months). Applications are considered from researchers with an established or emerging international reputation for scholarship or research leadership.

To meet the eligibility requirements of the EU Marie Curie programme, applicants may not have resided in the UK for more than 12 months in the 36 months prior to the reference date for this call (1 July 2014).

The Lymphatic Education & Research Network (LE&RN) is a 501(c)(3) not-for profit organization whose mission is to fight lymphatic disease and lymphedema through education, research and advocacy. LE&RN seeks to accelerate the prevention, treatment and cure of the disease while bringing patients and medical professionals together to address the unmet needs surrounding lymphatic disorders.

Lymphatic Education & Research Network Postdoctoral Fellowship Awards Program:

The LE&RN Postdoctoral Fellowship Program is designed to support postdoctoral scientists in academic, medical or research institutions throughout the world. The awards will support investigators who have recently received their doctorates, a critical point in career development when young scientists choose their lifelong research focus. The goal of the Fellowship Program is to expand and strengthen the pool of outstanding junior investigators in the field of lymphatic research.

Each applicant must be working under the supervision of an established investigator who is the designated Mentor. Two-year fellowships ranging from \$82,000 to \$95,000 will be awarded to fellows who have completed no more than three years of postdoctoral training by July 1st of the LE&RN funding cycle.

Postdoc Journal Invites Contributing Editors

Postdoc Journal, a Journal of Postdoctoral Research (JPR) and Postdoctoral Affairs (JPA), is currently seeking contributing editors from multiple disciplines. JPR publishes original research papers, reviews, progress articles, commentaries, perspectives and research highlights in ALL disciplines postdocs conduct research in. The journal is chalked out to be a monthly publication set to release on the 20th of each month. Interested postdocs are expected to contribute, at the least, 4 peer reviewed articles per year. The work could be in any of the formats supported by the journal, i.e. commentary, research highlight, progress article, perspectives, review and original research. Endorsed by an advisory panel of eminent scientists, and managed by a team of 60+ postdocs on the editorial board representing a range of universities and disciplines, JPR has been publishing papers since January of 2013. It is an initiative to highlight the significant contributions made by postdoctoral fellows around the world to ongoing research in ALL disciplines. To capitalize on the steady growth the journal has witnessed since its inception, Postdoc Journal invites applicants from ALL research disciplines to serve as contributing editors.

"The Fractured Teapot: Debating the Legacy of the Boston Tea Party"

The Boston Tea Party of 1773 is known to every schoolchild, but it has found a new place in public debate with the rise of the Tea Party movement in 2009. Professor of early American history, Ben Carp, will unearth some of the 'forgotten' history of the Boston Tea Party to explore the selective way we remember revolutionary Boston. Carp's goal is to show how generations of Americans have debated the meaning of the Tea Party and used it for different purposes, including abolitionists, the Ku Klux Klan, temperance advocates, and tax protesters. Carp has written for BBC History, Colonial Williamsburg, the Wall Street Journal, and the Washington Post, and he has appeared on BBC1, C-SPAN2, C-SPAN3, and the Discovery Channel.
