Post-doctoral enrichment program for minority postdoctoral fellows offered by Burroughs Wellcome Fund

Due date: 1/15/2015

Funding: provides a total of \$60,000 over 3 years to support the career development activities for underrepresented minority postdoctoral fellows in a degree-granting institution (an institution includes its affiliated graduate and medical schools, hospitals and research institutions) in the United States or Canada whose training and professional development are guided by mentors committed to helping them advance to stellar careers in biomedical or medical research. The Burroughs Wellcome Fund states it is committed to funding the next generation of scientists and researchers, thus has an interest in advancing the careers of underrepresented minority postdoctoral fellows. Generally, up to 10 awards will be granted for enrichment activities annually. This grant is meant to supplement

the training of postdocs whose research activities are already supported. It is not a research grant.
