I am writing to inform you of a new Fulbright initiative designed to better accommodate the interests and commitments of early career scholars. This year, the Fulbright U.S. Scholar Program is offering an additional application cycle for a select number of 2015-2016 postdoctoral awards.

The following awards in Europe are accepting applications until January 15, 2015:

- Belgium Award #5548 (Fulbright Postdoctoral Scholar Award: Belgium, EORTC)
 - The European Organization for Research and Treatment of Cancer (EORTC) is a leading cancer therapy and research center located in Brussels, Belgium that is seeking postdoctoral candidates who will receive training in the methodology of cancer clinical and translational research using data from EORTC databases. Candidates should have an interest in cancer clinical and translational research.
- European Union Award #5547(Fulbright Postdoctoral Scholar Award: European Union, EUI (Florence)
 - The selected candidate will spend nine months at the European University Institute in Florence, focusing on developing professional skills such as teaching, academic writing and publishing, and job market presentation within the field of EU studies. Applicants should have a demonstrated interest in EU studies that is represented through the publication of articles which carry observations, prognoses, or suggestions for current topics

important to the transatlantic relationship.

- France Award #5552(Fulbright Postdoctoral Scholar Award: France, EHESS)
 - The Ecole des Hautes Etudes en Sciences Sociales (EHESS), founded in 1975 in Paris, is a prestigious school that gathers 700 high-profile scholars from various disciplines and areas studies. The EHESS trains students in all disciplines of the humanities and social sciences. The first mission of the EHESS is to help young researchers acquire an international scientific background through the quality of its training, the international profiles of its professors and the quality and scope of its research.
- France Award #5546 (Fulbright Postdoctoral Scholar Award: France, Nord Pas de Calais)
 - Situated at the heart of the "Golden Triangle" of London, Paris and Brussels, Nord Pas de Calais boasts a long-standing tradition in research. The Nord Pas de Calais region welcomes candidates in the hard and social sciences as well as the humanities, including museum conservation, culture and preservation and visual art creation.

Fulbright Support for U.S. Postdoctoral Researchers to Taiwan The Fulbright Taiwan Postdoctoral Scholar in the Arts, Education, Humanities, Professional Fields and Social Sciences Award is currently seeking applications from American postdoctoral academics, professionals, artists, performers and writers interested in exploring new avenues for professional development and in specializing in Taiwan-related political, social, and cultural developments.

More than 1,500 Taiwan scholars to the U.S. and 1,100 U.S. scholars to Taiwan have exchanged ideas and explored new research directions through Fulbright over the last 50 years.

Grants will support up to ten months of postdoctoral research at a public or private academic institution in Taiwan.

Eligibility: Interested candidates must hold a doctorate degree conferred by the start of their grant and no earlier than January 1, 2012 from an institution in the United States.

Clinical Trials in Thalassemia Cell and Gene Therapy Grant Award

Due February 2, 2015

Up to \$60,000 for one year will be available including indirect costs of 8%, with possibility of renewal

The Cooley's Anemia Foundation invites national and international applicants to apply for grants to facilitate clinical trials in Cell and Gene Therapy to advance a cure for thalassemia. Both phase I (safety) and phase II (efficacy) trials are eligible for support.

Support for Ongoing Clinical Research in Thalassemia

Due January 16, 2015

Stipends are \$40,000 annually with possibility of one-year renewal, administrative cost is limited to 10% of total

The goal of this initiative is to support investigators from all disciplines and backgrounds (MD, RN, PhD, MPH, MSW or other disciplines) with their ongoing clinical projects to address one or more of the following areas impacting patients with thalassemia, including but not limited to: cardiac issues and iron overload; fertility, pregnancy and family planning; quality of life, psychosocial impact and/or burden of disease.

This level of funding would be appropriate for support of innovative small-scale pilot studies, observational trials, or ancillary support for ongoing interventional studies. Junior and senior faculty are eligible; fellows and trainees are not eligible. Investigators must interact directly with patients or patient-related data. Basic research, when included in this "Ongoing Clinical Research" program, must be related to a direct clinical focus of the grant application.

Research Fellowship Grant

Due February 2, 2015

Awards are for July 1-June 30, and are renewable, at \$32,000/year

The Cooley's Anemia Foundation invites national and international clinical and basic science investigators (postdoctoral or junior faculty) to apply for its prestigious fellowship program. Postdoctoral applicants must have adequate preceptorship and guidance by an experienced investigator. The sponsor of a postdoctoral fellow should be an investigator with adequate experience and at an institution with adequate research facilities. Preference will be given to applicants who have not yet achieved R-01 funding from the NIH.

Foundation for Anesthesia Education and Research - 3 RFP's due 2/15 - \$50-\$175K

The Foundation for Anesthesia Education and Research

Deadlines: February 15 and August 15

Amount: varies (see below), but no indirects allowed

The Foundation for Anesthesia Education and Research provides research grant

funding for anesthesiologists and anesthesiology trainees to gain additional training in basic science, clinical and translational, health services and education research.

1) Mentored Research Training Grants

The Mentored Research Training Grant is a two-year, \$175,000 grant for anesthesiology faculty members who have completed their core anesthesiology residencies within the past 10 years. The MRTG requires 75 percent research time. It is available for basic science (MRTG-BS), clinical or translational research (MRTG-CT) or health services research (MRTG-HSR)

2) Research Fellowship Grant

The Research Fellowship Grant is a one-year, \$75,000 grant for anesthesiology trainees after the CA-1 year. The RFG is awarded in conjunction with clinical training in an anesthesiology residency or fellowship program. The RFG requires 80 percent research time.

3) Research in Education Grant

The Research in Education Grant is a two-year, \$100,000 grant available for faculty members of any rank. Year one and year two are funded up to \$50,000. The REG is focused on developing innovative techniques for anesthesia education. The REG requires 40 percent research time.
