The Alachua Region Science and Engineering Fair is scheduled for Thursday, February 6, 2014 at the Santa Fe College Gymnasium. The regional science fair will showcase outstanding projects from students in grades 6 through 12 and will include public, private and charter schools in Alachua County. However, in order to host the fair, approximately 60-70 additional judges are required. Judges at this level should have a bachelor's or higher degree.

Science fair judging consists of talking with students about their research to determine place awards, state and international science fair status, and to select the best overall project winners. Judges are asked to check in between 7:30 and 8:00 AM on February 6th. A continental breakfast will be served upon arrival and a working lunch will be provided. Judging is usually completed by 3:00 PM. This will be a wonderful opportunity to communicate with some of the best science students in our district.
