CAREER CATALYST RESEARCH GRANTS - BASIC/TRANSLATIONAL and CLINICAL

Career Catalyst Research Grants are intended to foster promising breast cancer researchers who are in the early stages of their faculty careers by providing support for up to three years of "protected time" for research career development under the guidance of a Mentor Committee. It is expected that awardees will launch independent research careers and successfully compete for subsequent research project funding in breast cancer following the successful completion of a CCR Grant, thereby playing key roles in reducing breast cancer incidence and mortality, with the ultimate goal of ending breast cancer forever. Applicants/Pls may request funding of up to \$150,000 per year (combined direct and indirect costs) for up to three years (\$450,000). *Pre-Application Due: July 17, 2014, by 1 p.m., Eastern Standard Time.* For more detail:

POSTDOCTORAL FELLOWSHIP GRANTS - BASIC/TRANSLATIONAL and CLINICAL

Postdoctoral Fellowship Grants are intended to attract and support promising scientists and clinician/scientists who are embarking on careers dedicated to breast cancer research. Applicants/Pls may request funding of up to \$60,000 per year (direct costs only) for a minimum of two years (\$120,000) and maximum of three years (\$180,000). Note, final funding decisions and amounts rest with the Komen Board of Directors. *Pre-Application Due: July 17, 2014, by 1 p.m., Eastern Standard Time.* For more detail:

Symphony of the Americas Summerfest 2014

Symphony of the Americas Summerfest 2014 at UF August 15

For the past 22 summers, Fort Lauderdale's Symphony of the Americas has presented its summer festival, Summerfest, hosting an acclaimed European chamber orchestra for one month of performances throughout Florida and the Americas. The orchestra is joined by selected members of the Symphony of the Americas and is funded in part by the Broward Cultural Council. Symphony of the Americas is Broward's only professional orchestra,

and Broward Center for the Performing Arts is its performance home.

This summer, Symphony of the Americas will host the Mission Chamber Orchestra of Rome in a return engagement, under the baton of symphony artistic director Maestro James Brooks-Bruzzese. Orchestral concerts feature Carnival of Venice, La Bella Cubana, Vivaldi's Four Seasons, Sarasate's Habanera as well as music of Dohnanyi, Grieg, Gustav Holst and world premieres by Italian composer and soloist Lorenzo Turchi-Floris, and Panamanian composer Juan Castillo. The orchestra continues in cultural exchange throughout South Florida and for a week in Panama.

Highlighted this summer is their featured performance at the Panama Canal Centennial Celebration at the University of Florida, Gainesville, on August 15, under the direction of Panamanian born Brooks-Bruzzese. The concert will take place at the Phillips Center for the Performing Arts at 7:30 p.m. Tickets are only \$15 can be purchased online at http://performingarts.ufl.edu/events/chamber-orchestra-summerfest-2014 or by calling the box office at 352-392-2787.

The Mission Chamber Orchestra, based in Rome, is an established international musical ensemble. During the past six years, this artistic and humanitarian chamber orchestra, formed by the organization Musicfor, has been acclaimed throughout Europe. Its musicians are experienced professionals — graduates and faculty members of noted European conservatories, devoted to presenting musical excellence and organizing performances which are of high humanitarian importance. From Baroque to contemporary, the MCO offers innovative programs to provide its audience with a wide range of music under the guidance of Artistic Director Lorenzo Turchi-Floris. The Mission Chamber Orchestra has a partnership with and performs often in the Vatican.
