Team-Based Learning: An Exciting & Interactive Alternative to Lecture-Based Teaching

With Wayne T. McCormack, Ph.D., Director, Clinical & Translational Science Predoctoral Training Program, UF Clinical & Translational Science Institute and Dept. of Pathology, Immunology & Laboratory Medicine

Just because most of the teaching you have been exposed to probably involved passive learning via lectures doesn't mean you can't explore using active learning strategies when you begin teaching! Team-based learning is a structured small group active learning method that motivates students through a readiness assurance process to come to class prepared, teaches team skills via experience, and most importantly focuses classroom time on higher order skills such as problem-solving and decision-making. This workshop will be a great introduction to TBL, and will be conducted in the TBL format. Participants will prepare ahead, take a readiness assurance test, and then engage actively with their assigned team members. The structure, process, and essential characteristics of an effective TBL module will be emphasized. Please read "TBL_Workshop_Prereading (PDF)" before the workshop, which is available online at

1) Explain the key components of a successful TBL module.

2) Outline how they would construct a TBL module from a set of objectives.

4) Illustrate how to transform a small group into a productive learning-team.

To that end, ASF seeks applications for postdoctoral fellowships in preclinical, translational, and clinical research on all aspects of Angelman syndrome. The purpose of the award is to promote Angelman syndrome-related research by a young investigator, support novel research initiatives, and further existing Angelman-related research projects.

The purpose of this award is to:

The amount of the award equals \$55,000 per year for two years, contingent on an adequate progress report during the first year.
