## Autism Speaks - funding opportunities due 10/1 and 11/12/14

Our office wanted to be sure you are aware of these two opportunities for funding from Autism Speaks. If you or any of your colleagues choose to pursue an application, please let me know -- I would be happy to help with it. Please also forward this note to anyone else who might be interested.

### 1. Meixner Postdoctoral Fellowship in Translational Research

(Two Year total maximum award = \$148,400)

The goal of this program is to support well-qualified postdoctoral scientists pursuing training in autism spectrum disorder (ASD) translational research. The program is open to applicants from public or private institutions doing preclinical or clinical research. Applicants are expected to detail a project that bridges basic laboratory research and behavioral or biomedical clinical research, and must include a training plan that includes mentoring in both basic and clinical research environments. Projects must have the fundamental translational research aim of accelerating the conversion of basic scientific discoveries into novel and more effective methods or products used to diagnose, prevent, or treat ASD. "Bench-to-bedside" approaches that delineate a path from preclinical models of ASD to well-defined patient populations, and "back-translational" projects that enrich the skill sets of behaviorists and clinicians through basic research on ASD biology and mechanisms of therapeutic intervention are equally encouraged. The results should have the potential to lead to or facilitate preclinical or clinical trials to improve outcomes for people with ASD.

The number of fellowships Autism Speaks will award will be determined by its available financial resources and the fit of the proposed research within the Autism Speaks portfolio. Each award will be for a period of two years and will include a competitive stipend, and a \$10,500 annual allowance for professional conference travel, research costs and supplies, and/or fringe benefits. Indirect costs are not allowed. Stipend ranges can be found below. The second year stipend will be raised to the next level.

The postdoctoral fellowship stipend level will be determined by the number of years of postdoctoral experience at the time of the award to a maximum of \$63,700 per year. Fellows are permitted to obtain additional awards or grants to *cover research* expenses only. Fellows may not hold any other award or grant that supplements their stipend.

## 2. <u>Dennis Weatherstone Predoctoral Fellowship Program</u>

(Two Year total maximum award = \$60,000)

Autism Speaks invites applications from predoctoral students interested in pursuing careers in autism research. The Dennis Weatherstone Fellows will work directly with mentors who are leading scientists in autism related research. This program supports the growth of a promising cadre of young scientists who will make autism research their chosen field. In order to crossfertilize ideas and facilitate a network of collaboration, the Weatherstone program will include group interaction among the class of fellows and an annual meeting with the Weatherstone family and the Stavros Niarchos Foundation. The primary purpose of the Weatherstone fellowship is to provide highly qualified candidates with exceptional research training opportunities broadly related to the study of Autism Spectrum Disorders. General areas of research include: behavioral, psychosocial and /or educational challenges; family issues; language / communication; environmental factors; epidemiology and public health; health services research; genetics and/or genomics; health services research; medical / psychiatric comorbidities; biomedical and/or pharmacological interventions; developmental biology; neuroscience; physiology / anatomy; and technology development.

The Autism Speaks Weatherstone Fellowship Awards will be granted to qualified predoctoral students. The two-year fellowship includes an annual \$30,000 award that includes a stipend of \$22,500 plus a \$7,500 annual allowance for fringe benefits, research costs and supplies, professional travel and/or tuition reimbursement. Indirect costs are not allowed. Acceptance of any other award or grant that supplements research training expenses or the stipend requires approval that will be granted only in rare cases.
