# Burroughs Wellcome Fund "Preterm Birth Initiative" RFP - due December 1

#### **Preterm Birth Initiative**

\$600,000 over 4 years (\$150K per year), no IDC's

**Award Timeline** 

Dec. 1, 2014 - Proposal due

Feb. 23, 2015 - Finalists selected

April 15, 2015 - In-person interviews

June 1, 2015 - Award begins

The Preterm Birth Initiative was created to increase the understanding of the biological mechanisms underlying parturition and spontaneous preterm birth. The initiative is designed to stimulate both creative individual scientists and multi-investigator teams to approach the problem of preterm birth using creative basic and translation science methods. Postdoctoral fellows nearing their transition to independent investigator status through senior established investigators are encouraged to apply. Molecular and computational approaches such genetics/genomics, immunology, microbiology, evolutionary biology, mathematics, engineering, and other basic sciences hold enormous potential for new insights independently or in conjunction with more traditional areas of parturition research such as maternal fetal medicine, obstetrics, and pediatrics. The formation of new connections between reproductive scientists and investigators who are involved in other areas will give preterm birth research a fresh and unique look, and stimulate a new workforce to tackle this challenge.

Proposals should address the biomedical causes and molecular mechanisms

underlying (preterm) parturition including but not limited to periimplantational events, placentation, fetal determinants, fetal-maternal immune responses, biological basis for racial-ethnic disparities, mechanisms relating preterm birth to other adverse pregnancy outcomes, biology of normal labor, genomics, evolutionary influences and other approaches. Proposals seeking to identify biomarkers predicting preterm birth are welcome.

Up to five (5) research grants will be awarded in this award cycle.

# RFA -- National Radio Astronomy Observatory (NRAO) -- up to \$154,000 -- due 11/3/14

#### Jansky Fellowships

Up to \$154,000 total over 2 years

Due Nov. 3, 2014

The 2015 Jansky Fellowship Program provides outstanding postdoctoral opportunities for research in astronomy. Jansky Fellows formulate and carry out investigations either independently or in collaboration with others within the wide framework of interests of the Observatory. Prior radio experience is not required and multi-wavelength projects leading to a synergy with NRAO instruments are encouraged. The NRAO also encourages applications from candidates with interest in radio astronomy instrumentation, computation, and theory.

Appointments may be made for positions at any of the NRAO sites: Socorro, NM; Green Bank, WV; and Charlottesville, VA. In addition to appointments at NRAO sites, non-resident Jansky Fellowships may be offered for appointments that are hosted at a university within the United States. Applicants requesting a non-resident Jansky Fellowship should present a compelling case for how their research plans require an appointment at the host institution. Frequent and/or long term visits to NRAO sites are encouraged. Split Fellowships with time spent at NRAO and a university within the US are permitted.

The starting salary will be \$64,260 per year for an appointment of two

year's duration, with possible renewal for a third year. A research budget of up to \$10,000 per year is provided for travel and computing requirements. Fellows are eligible for page charge support, vacation accrual, health insurance coverage, and a moving allowance. In addition, up to \$3,000 per year is provided to non-NRAO institutions hosting Jansky Fellows to defray local institutional costs. Appointments of more than one Jansky Fellow at a single external institution at a given time are strongly discouraged. A list of blocked institutions for 2015 can be found on our website.
