Priscilla Wald to discuss human life in the age of biotechnology

A scholar of U.S. literature and culture from Duke University is giving a free talk on Thursday, January 29th at the University of Florida. Her talk will examine how scientific advances in the 20th and 21st centuries have changed how we think about human life. The talk will be at 5:30 pm in Smathers Library (East) 100.

This lecture is the fourth in a series of six organized by the UF Center for the Humanities and the Public Sphere entitled *The Work of the Humanities: Critical Thinking in Life and Labor* during the fall 2014 and spring 2015 semesters. This series will show how the humanities play a key role in understanding and shaping the future workplace.

In her talk, "More Human than Human: The Work of Life in the Age of Biotechnical Reproduction," Priscilla Wald will analyze key works of science fiction, significant legal cases, and key policy debates that help us to understand the convergence of scientific innovation and political change. In a growing world of robots, clones, and human enhancement, new questions are raised about the future of human identity; and it is in the genres of science fiction film and literature that our excitement and anxieties about the future can best be

explored.

Priscilla Wald teaches and works on U.S. literature and culture as Professor of English and Women's Studies at Duke University. She is author of several books including *Constituting Americans: Cultural Anxiety and Narrative Form*, and most recently *Contagious: Cultures, Carriers, and the Outbreak Narrative*. Her current work focuses on the intersections among the law, literature, science, and medicine.
