The Science & SciLifeLab Prize for Young Scientists

The Prize is awarded annually to one young scientist for outstanding life science research for which he/she was awarded a doctoral degree in the previous two years. The topic of the entrant's thesis research must be in one of the following categories: Cell and Molecular Biology, Genomics and Proteomics, Ecology and Environment, Translational Medicine. Eligible entrants must have been awarded their doctoral degree in 2013 or 2014, and the subject of their thesis should match one of the Subject Tracks below. The winners from each category will compete for the grand prize.

Prize money: US\$30,000 for the grand prize winner, US\$10,000 for each of the

category winners.

Publication: The grand prize winning essay will be published in Science and essays from the each of the category winners will be published online.

Application deadline: August 1, 2015

July Academic IT Training Available

Instructors are encouraged to register for <u>academic IT training offered this month</u> to enhance their technology use prior to the fall 2015 term. The summer training schedule offers the latest pedagogical information on teaching and learning with more than 20 sessions. All sessions are free and taught in HUB 221.

New workshops join popular favorites to provide a comprehensive learning environment for both returning and new online instructors. The Canvas Boot Camp is available throughout the summer, with a Saturday session offered each month. The three-hour Boot Camp provides an in-depth overview of the new e-Learning platform, meant to teach proficiency and prepare instructors to launch their courses. Qualtrics and SPSS workshops are available, starting with the basics and advancing to foster program expertise. Other training topics include Respondus, an online examination tool that can save time and reduce cheating, and Peerceptiv, a research-based, peer review tool that can be used within Canvas. Additional July academic IT training options include (but are not limited to) a three-part series on Peer Review for Teaching and Learning, BigBlueButton, and VoiceThread.

SQCC supports and encourages advanced research on Oman across a variety of academic disciplines through the Research Fellowship Program. Launched in 2010, this program funds scholars across several academic disciplines to conduct research in the Sultanate of Oman.

The program is offered annually and is open to Ph.D. candidates and post-doctoral scholars. The fellowship awards up to \$51,000 for the fellow or team of fellows.
