Environmental Monitoring

UF's Biotility is offering the short-course *Environmental Monitoring* (December 4), and UF postdocs are welcome at our reduced rate of \$25 each. This course is typically taken by industry professionals, or anyone interested in working in the private sector of the bioscience/biotechnology industry. Biotility is part of UF's Center of Excellence for Regenerative Health Biotechnology, and is located in Progress Park (Alachua), which is about 20 minutes from campus.

A requirement for the production of biopharmaceutical products is to ensure freedom from contamination by adventitious agents such as bacteria, fungi,

mycoplasma and viruses. Contamination issues may impact product safety and lead to lengthy investigations and costly recalls. Environmental monitoring of cleanrooms and adjacent areas is a critical component of a company's contamination control strategy and is required for regulatory compliance. Participants in this course will be introduced to the principles of environmental monitoring including hands-on activities. Topics encompass regulatory requirements, types and sources of contamination, cleanroom classifications, sampling methods and frequencies, interpretation of environmental testing results, and types of cleanroom microorganisms.

L'Oréal USA for Women In Science Fellowship: Application Opens November 30, 2015

The L'Oréal-UNESCO For Women in Science program recognizes and rewards the contributions women make in STEM fields and identifies exceptional women researchers committed to serving as role models for younger generations. More than 2,250 women scientists in over 110 countries have been recognized since the program began in 1998.

In the US, the For Women In Science fellowship program awards five postdoctoral women scientists annually with grants of \$60,000 each. Applicants are selected from a variety of fields, including the life and physical/material sciences, technology (including computer science), engineering, and mathematics.

Applications will open on November 30, 2015 and are due by February 5, 2016.

This workshop, organized by Dr. Sean Trainor, will be held on **11 December**, **2015 from 2:00 - 5:00 pm in Pugh Hall 120**. The first hour of the workshop will focus on general tips and strategies for effective public writing.
