The University of Florida Claude D. Pepper Older American's Independence Center (OAIC), director Marco Pahor, MD, is seeking innovative, interdisciplinary Pilot and Exploratory Study (PES) applications which address the focus of "Mobility and Prevention of Disability". Successful applications should collect pilot data that will lead to extramural research grants and/or career development awards.

Basic science and clinical research studies are encouraged, may originate from investigators at any College within the University of Florida or the VA Medical Center, and can include collaborations with other institutions, particularly those with OAIC's. Basic science projects are allowed up to \$25,000 per year and clinical research projects which involve enrollment of human subjects are allowed up to \$50,000 per year in direct costs for two years. Smaller PESs are allowed < \$10,000 per year for one year.

In this workshop, attendees will learn about the legal relationships between author, publisher and reader in order to understand how to protect one's own intellectual property rights as authors, to respect others' rights, and to interpret common provisions in publisher agreements. Additionally, we will review the strengths and weaknesses of various publishing models including open access and best practices for locating and evaluating open access publication venues.
