Imagining Florida: The Place We Call Home 2016 Spring Humanities Series Presents *Africa in Florida*

The Center for the Humanities and the Public Sphere warmly invites UF faculty, staff, and students to its annual spring series *Imagining Florida: The Place We Call Home*. Reflecting the Center's 2015-16 focus on publics, this year's series explores the public work of the humanities, within and beyond the academy. Co-curated with community partners across Gainesville, it asks how the humanities infuse our everyday lives and especially, our experiences of "home" in Florida.

Imagining Florida features five lectures and discussions, each showcasing different humanistic disciplines. Running between January and April 2016, all events are free and encourage public participation. The goal of the University of Florida Postdoctoral Research Symposium is to promote the research of UF postdocs and to provide avenues for continued professional development as set outlined by the National Postdoctoral Association (NPA). Communication Skills and Professionalism are two of the six Core Competencies the NPA (National Postdoctoral Association) promotes as critical to postdoc success. Postdocs in both oral and poster presentations will be judged on how well they can convey their research to an educated lay audience.

Oral Presentation first place winner receives \$200. Oral Presentation second place winner receives \$100. The four winners for poster presentations – from four separate judging groups receive \$75 each.

UF Postdocs are invited to submit abstracts and elect either poster presentation or oral presentation. The top six abstract submissions will be selected by the Office of Postdoctoral Affairs (OPA) advisory committee for oral presentation. Oral presenters will be notified by March 15th of their selection. Those not selected for an oral presentation will be invited to participate in the poster session. Judging of both oral and poster presentation will take place the day of the event. Oral presenters are expected to prepare a 10 minute PowerPoint presentation with 5 additional minutes for questions. Posters presenters will be notified of board sizing prior to the event.

To submit your abstract and be considered for judging, please complete the *abstract submission form* (enter GatorLink User Name and Password when prompted) by *February 29, 2016.* The schedule for the event is included below.
