The purpose of this course is to assist students in conceptualizing their role as a college and university faculty and to prepare them for their transition to a faculty appointment and/or for teaching at the college/university level.

Course objectives include:

- 1. Write components of their electronic teaching portfolio (i.e., teaching philosophy, course syllabus, research agenda).
- 2. Describe the steps to prepare for interviewing for a college/university appointment.
- 3. Recognize factors that impact transitioning from graduate student status to becoming a professor.
- 4. Discuss philosophical approaches of teaching.
- 5. Identify teaching strategies that are appropriate to large and small group learning.
- 6. Differentiate the use of instructional strategies that promote student engagement.
- 7. Discuss the benefits of constructing a teaching portfolio.
- 8. Recognize different forms of providing student feedback.
- 9. Reflect upon the relationship between their usage of time and progress towards tenure.
- 10. Identify instructional strategies that promote the development of critical thinking.
