Please submit one-page proposals describing your chosen book along with student assignments and expectations. These courses will meet one day per week for one period, so please keep that in mind as you decide on the output you expect from students. With input from students and faculty, the UF Honors Program will select up to thirty courses for the Fall 2017 semester.

The Honors Program cannot offer additional salary for faculty who wish to teach such a

course, but we will offer \$1000 in professional development funds (to be used for travel, etc.) to those faculty whose courses are selected.

Application Materials: **Deadline is February 1st, 2017**

1. Completed Bouchet Graduate Honor Society [Nomination Forms](#) from each of the following:
 - The nominee's dissertation advisor or committee member
 - A graduate faculty member or administrator with knowledge of the candidate's leadership and character attributes
2. Current unofficial transcript

3. A current Curriculum Vitae or resume
4. 250-word dissertation or research abstract
5. Statement of purpose (2-page maximum) from the candidate indicating their educational and career accomplishments and future professional goals, past and current academic experience and the ways in which they have and will continue to fulfill the five thrusts of scholarship, character, leadership, service and advocacy and how the candidate's educational accomplishments will contribute to the mission of the Bouchet Society.
