# Authors' Rights and Responsibilities: Understanding Copyright & Open Access in Modern Scholarly Publishing

In this workshop, attendees will learn about the legal relationships between author, publisher and reader in order to understand how to protect one's own intellectual property rights as authors, to respect others' rights, and to interpret common provisions in publisher agreements. Additionally, we will review the strengths and weaknesses of various publishing models including open access and best practices for locating and evaluating open access publication venues.

The UF Dropbox for Education service has been expanded. Initially launched in May, 2016 for faculty, the free service is now available to all faculty, postdocs, and staff. With up to 1 TB of storage available, Dropbox is an excellent, secure way to share files for academic, administrative, and research purposes across campus or across the world, using the same interface and functionalities everyone is accustomed to using.

The Dropbox for Education service is approved by the Information Security Office as a

file-sharing tool. The Standard for working with Restricted and Sensitive data applies when using Dropbox for Education. If no local IT manager is available then contact the UF Computing Help Desk before uploading a file that might contain data classified as Restricted or Sensitive.
