VIVO is a research-focused discovery tool that enables collaboration among scientists across all disciplines. Establishing a VIVO account will allow you access to a national network of scientists for research and collaboration.

Participating institutions besides UF include: Cornell University, Indiana University, The Scripps Research Institute, Weill Cornell Medical College, Washington University in St. Louis School of Medicine and Ponce School of Medicine. Institutions running software such as Harvard Profiles and Loki are also part of the VIVO data ecosystem. The VIVO ontology (data model) is an official researcher networking recommendation of the Clinical and Translational Science Award consortium.
