The Ann Schreiber Mentored Investigator Award

I want to be sure you are aware of this funding from the Ovarian Cancer Research Fund. I would like to know if you or any of your colleagues choose to pursue an application, and would be happy to help with it. Please also forward this note to anyone else who might be interested.

The application deadline for LOIs is 5:00pm EST on May 6, 2014. All applicants will be notified of their status in June. For those selected to submit full proposals, full proposals will be due August 1, 2014.

The Ann Schreiber Mentored Investigator Award:

The Ann Schreiber Mentored Investigator Award (formerly the Ann Schreiber Research Training Programs of Excellence Award) provides funding for trainees who are working under the supervision of a mentor who is a recognized leader in the field of ovarian cancer research. Applicants must be clinical fellows (Gynecologic Oncology, Medical Oncology), or post-doctoral fellows. Candidates for this program must have an MD or a PhD degree.

Applicants must be either clinical fellows (Gynecologic Oncology, Medical Oncology) or post-doctoral fellows. Candidates for this grant must have an M.D. or Ph.D. degree.

The Ann Schreiber Mentored Investigator Award provides a total of \$75,000 to be used over one or two years. Although the trainee may take part in some non-research activities (e.g. class work, clinical activities) at least 90% effort should be devoted to research during the tenure of the OCRF award.
